October 13, 2009

The Town of Burlington held its regular monthly meeting on October 13, 2009 at the Town Hall.

Officers present: Ken Hockley, Larry Zeitner, Ken Cook, Wade Aagard and Doug Allen. Also present, Bruce Dooley, Norma Rose, Ryan Olson, Neil Stanger and Shane Trotter.

Mayor Kenneth Hockley called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

The minutes of September 8, 2009 were read and reviewed by the Mayor and Council.

Larry made a motion to approve, seconded by Wade, all were in favor.

The Town has \$255,350.67 in the General Fund \$765.98 in the Capitol Projects Fund, \$79,463.77 in the Water Fund, and \$ 21,377.62 in the Sewer Fund.

Doug made a motion to accept the vouchers as presented, seconded by Ken Cook. Motion passed, all in favor.

Shane reported that the plans for the side walk will be made and copies of plans and blue prints can be picked up at Holm & Blough in Cody. There will be a walk through on October 20, 2009 at 10 a.m. bids have to be in by October 22, 2009. Shane will get with the Mayor & Council on October 26, 2009 to decide on bids. Shane wants to get a portion of the side walk started this fall, depending on the weather. The council is willing to work with the construction company as to final completion date, again depending on weather as we are getting close to winter.

There was no report on who owns the Srygley property yet.

The Elm Street test street was discussed. The council decided to wait a few months to see how the street holds up. Shane said that it should last at least 5 years. All agreed that it has improved the street and the dust problem and hopes that it will continue to.

Mayor Hockley reported that the news letter on the Consensus grant, WAM thinks it will stay the same until 2011.

The Town of Byron sent an invitation to their Open House Celebration on October 17th. Larry Zeitner said that he would attend for the Town of Burlington.

Neil Stanger, representing for Jan Mollenbrink, Burlington Post Master, passed on a letter for Mayor Hockley to read in regards to the community bulletin board located in front of the

post office. The council agreed to see if they could find someone to take on the project of building one rather than buying one already built. It was suggested that perhaps a Boy Scout would be interested in the project. Ryan Olson will look into the possibility, and that the council would vote on it at the next meeting.

Ken Cook reported that he has talked with Chris Edwards about the dissolution of the Husky Homeowners Association and that she would have to check on the laws and get back with him.

There was a report that the road where the gas company dug across needed some gravel. Bruce said that it has been done.

Ken Cook discussed the alley and wanted to know when the Town was going to start making the alley. Bruce talked to John and reported that as soon as John could get at it he would start on the alley, they will have it done by spring.

Bruce reported that he is working on the slide in the park and hopes to have it all fixed before spring. Bruce reported that most of the water pipes have been blown out, and will be working on getting them all done as soon as possible.

The Eagle Scout done a nice job on the fire pit in the Centennial Park. It looks real good, Good Job.

Kodiak Construction delivered the Towns Water truck on October 13, 2009. Council agreed that it looked good. Town purchased a 1991 Ford Lab cab/chassis, diesel fuel truck for watering the streets. S/N 1FTXS85A3MVA13052.

Mayor Hockley made a motion to go into Executive meeting at 8:15 p.m.

Regular meeting called back to order at 8:30 p.m.

Ken Cook has been in contact with the Historical Society about the Old Hotel. They are planning on coming to Burlington to look at it.

Wade made a Motion to adjourn, seconded by Ken Cook. Meeting adjourned at 8:45 p.m. The next meeting will be November 10, 2009 at 7:30 p.m., at the Town Hall.
